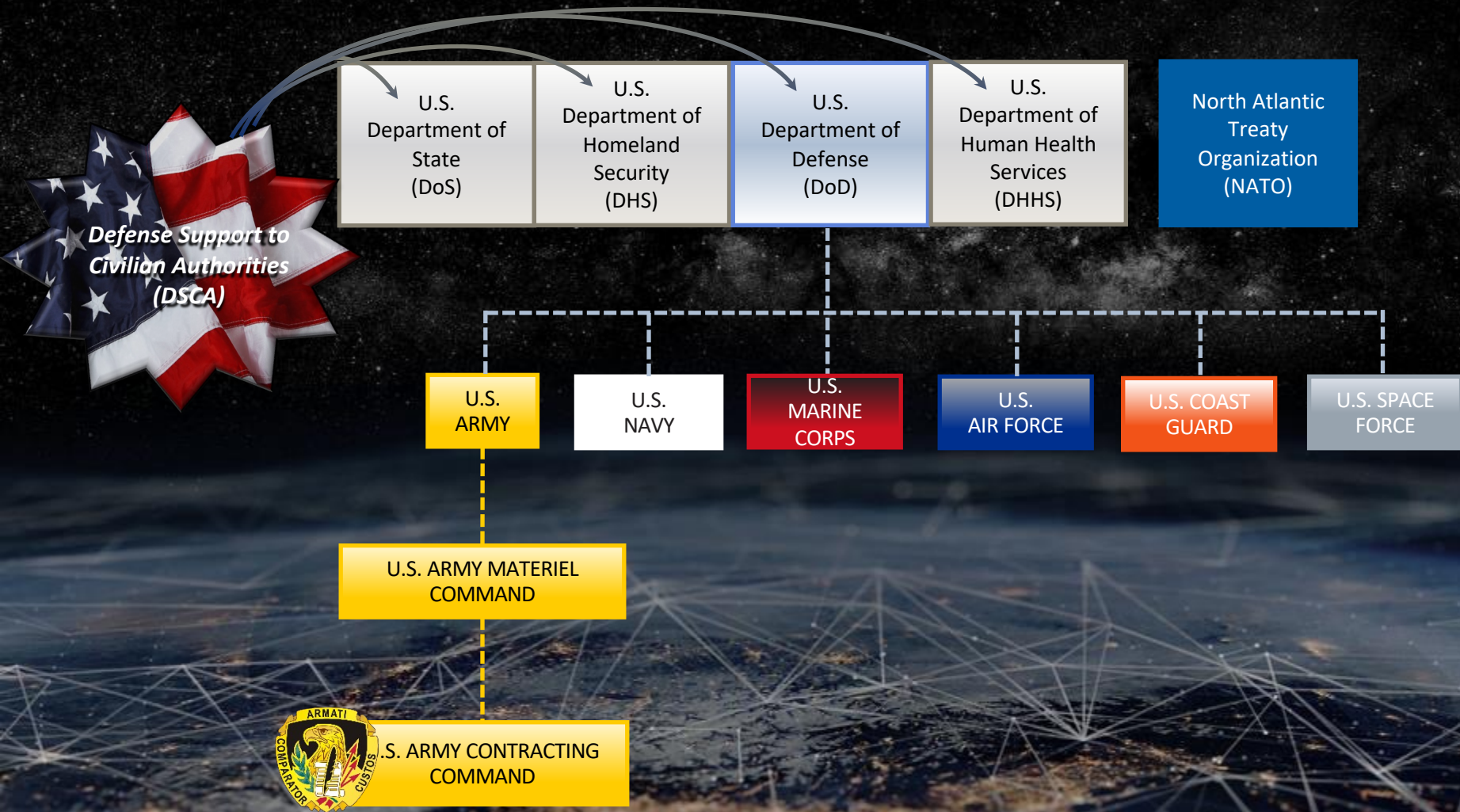

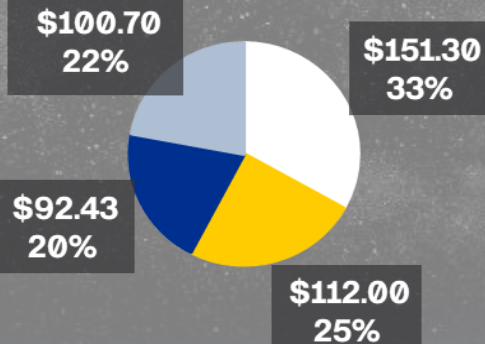

FY 23 Contracts (in \$B)



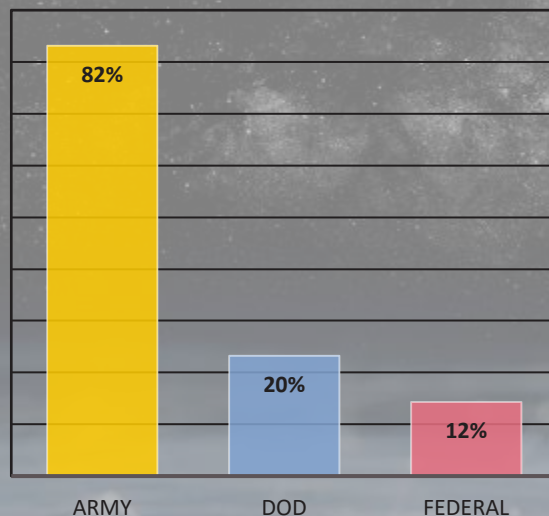
DoD Spend \$456.4B FY 23

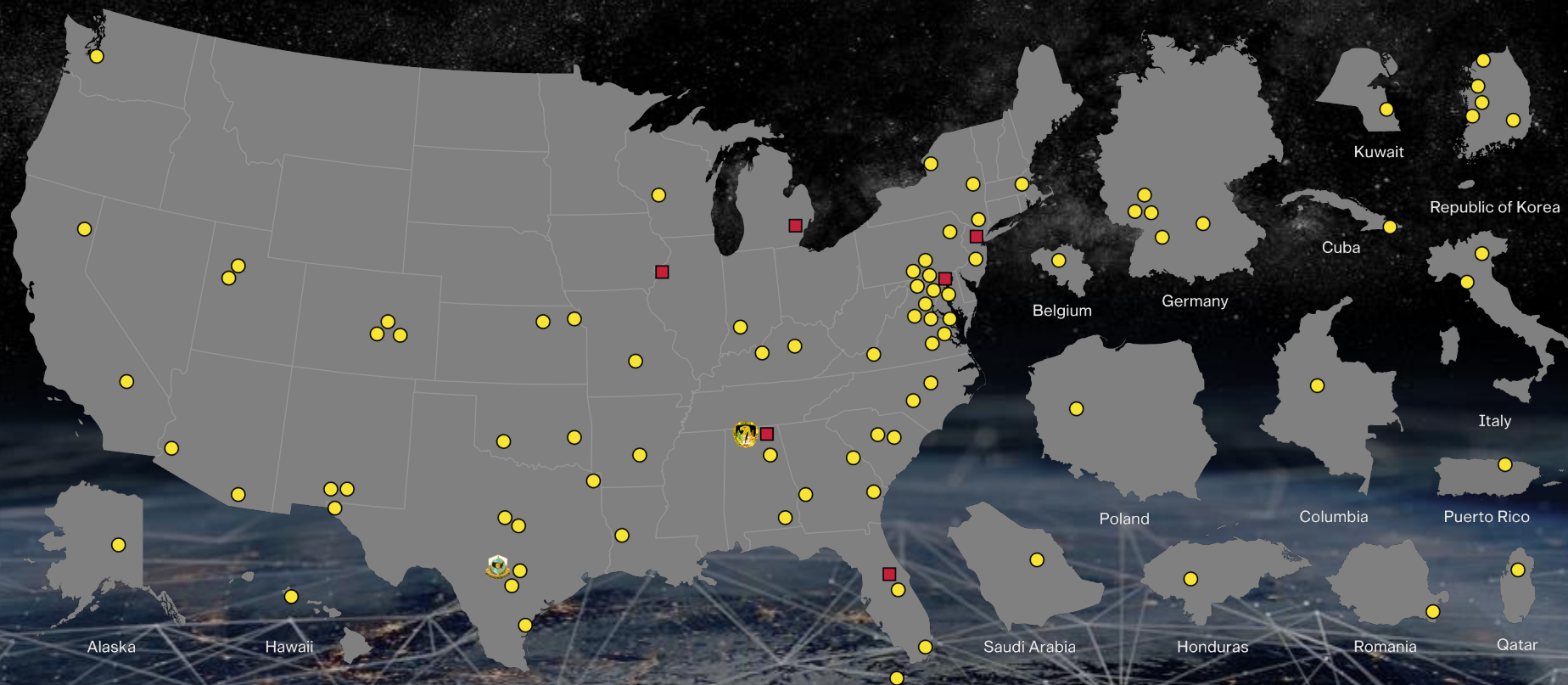

Operational Contracting Support Lessons Learned

- Train personnel in a multi-national or joint exercise environments
- Establish mechanisms, such as codes, to track spend and provide fiscal oversight in contracting
- Maximize use of contracts in-theater to leverage multi-national objectives, goals and priorities
- Advanced planning and coordination enables better integration and mission support
- Increase industry engagement events to build trust, establish common picture and interoperability to enhance mission success
